Advanced Trauma Care has become a top priority. We are building a dedicated Trauma Care Centre in our new campus at Kannigapuram, on the busy national highway between Chennai and Bangalore.

CMC is uniquely equipped for this. We have expert specialist doctors and highly skilled support teams. Togeth




support teams. Together they offer multidisciplinary care under one roof - a rarity in India. We are building on this to establish the first fully integrated Advanced

CMC was started as a response to avoidable tragedy. In 1890 our founder, Ida Scudder, was shocked when three women and their babies died in childbirth on a single night – all because there was no female doctor available. She became a doctor and opened a small hospital in Vellore.

Today CMC is a 2900 bed multi-speciality healthcare system encompassing community programmes as well as super specialities. We run over 200 courses for doctors and medical professionals. **CMC is consistently ranked in the top three medical institutions in India for clinical services, teaching and research.**

Golden Hour Fund

In road traffic accidents, every minute counts. The **'Golden Hour'** is the critical period within which timely action can prevent permanent damage. Stabilisation requires IV fluids, blood transfusions and scans. Immediate treatment costs around ₹20,000 for the first hour. Operations and 48 hours of ICU care for a person with life-threatening injuries can cost between ₹2 to ₹5 lakhs.

Most road accident victims are vulnerable pedestrians, cyclists or two wheeler riders. Many have no family, friends or money with them when they are injured. Some are unconscious and their identity is unknown. We cannot turn them away, so we are appealing for donations to the **Golden Hour Fund**. This will support patients during this critical period and beyond. Our target is to raise ₹100 crores so that we can treat such people in their hour of need.

"I did not know when Jeevan had the accident. A kind stranger organised emergency aid. He was admitted to a local hospital not equipped to handle trauma patients. As soon as I came to know, I shifted him to the Emergency Unit in CMC where he is now under specialised care. In such dire circumstances, it is a great relief to know that CMC Vellore has a trained unit dedicated to handle accident victims." (In the words of Jeevan's father)
