

PROJECT YUVA

Adolescents are defined as 10 - 25 year old young people. They form 1/5th of the population in India. For the most part, adolescent health needs are preventable yet unmet.

Teens feel uncomfortable seeking help from healthcare professionals. Project YUVA (Project for Youth Understanding and Verbalising Adolescence - PY) is an attempt at empowering adolescents with knowledge regarding their fundamental right to health, development, safety and self-advocacy. CMC, The Hope House and ChildLine India Foundation have signed an MOU to carry out PY as a collaborative venture. PY is a community based, peer driven adolescent health education program for adolescents both in schools and in the community, in Vellore district. PY was launched in October 2019. For now, two trained PY Educators (PYE) will be recruited to carry out health education sessions for 20.000 school children and 20 out-of-school communities.

All adolescents will be educated in the following 6 key areas of health :

- Nutrition, physical activity and prevention of non-communicable diseases
- 2. Injuries
- 3. Sexual and reproductive health
- 4. Substance use
- 5. Safety
- 6. Mental health

Jawadhi Hills Children's Homes

"The Don Bosco Home" for Tribal Boys in Jammunamarathur, Jawadhi hills, was started in the 1980's by the Selasian priests. The home provides free of cost boarding, lodging and meals for around 200 boys between the ages of 11 to 16 years. All the children in the home are either from remote and interior tribal hamlets without access to school services; or are orphans/children of single parents or have been identified from socially disadvantaged families. Apart from the basic needs that are provided, the boys are also given extra help with school work and tuitions, by 3 staff who have been particularly employed for this task. The relationship between Christian Medical College, particularly the Community Health department and the Don Bosco Home is a long standing one. From the inception of the effort to establish better health services among the tribal population of the Jawadhi hills, the Fathers from the home have been crucial contact points with the community. They have also always provided our health team material help in the form of transportation, clinic space as well as accommodation as and when required. Though the home has a capacity to accommodate 75 children they currently house 200, so an urgent need for expanding the set-up has been identified. They have begun building a new wing and will need additional furniture in the form of 100 bunk beds. 35 desks and chairs and also have expressed the need for help with building a fence enclosure for the premises.

From funds raised for this show, we will also be allocating a small sum to buy support equipment for the "Sneha Jyothi Home" for the Mentally Challenged also located in Jammunamarathur, Jawadhi Hills; which takes care of mentally challenged girls from the local tribal and non tribal population.
